marvelous achievements.



Johnny Jsom In his early coaching days at Liberty's original campus in Denton, now Athletic Director Johnny Isom remembers his start as a coach here in football, baseball, basketball, and track.

After playing seven years of professional baseball years ago, Coach Isom had a friend who worked at Liberty that suggested he come and speak to students in athletics, and the rest is history. He said his first impression of Liberty was sensing the presence of the Lord. Since coming to Liberty in 2001, Coach Isom has had the opportunity to give back to the school where he works and his daughter attends.

When he gave his first gift to Liberty many years ago, he said it was an easy decision to support the work and the people here. What surprised him in giving to Liberty was how rewarding it was to give to the Lord's kingdom.

When he made his most recent donation to the school, he said he felt like he was making a difference. "People may come and go, but the purpose of Liberty Christian School never changes, and that is the beauty of it."

Now you know! Your voice is critical for recruiting and retaining outstanding students and building our network of Warriors everywhere. Here are a few **fun facts** to share about our community. Let's celebrate these qualities that make **Liberty Christian School the place to be!**

Our Warrior Marching Band requires more than 45-50 hours of practice and rehearsal to fully learn the music and formations of one song. For a typical halftime show, the Warrior Marching Band performs three songs.

Project Lead the Way provides formative learning experiences for kindergarten-12th grade students by creating engaging, hands-on classroom environments that empower students to develop in-demand knowledge and skills they need to thrive.





Warrior Vision classes have produced films throughout the school year that have placed first the last three years in the TAPPS 6A Short Film Competitions and first the last two years in Documentary.

Upper and Middle School Digital Media classes are broadcasting on LCTV from their donated studio set from CBS 11. Students and parents can watch all broadcasts through the LCTV YouTube channel.





There are murals in the Middle School hallway that are designed and painted by current 8th graders.

A school record of 72 students, including grades 5–12, signed up for "Mary Poppins" auditions, which will debut February 18–21.





The Upper School Sports Performance program integrated two new systems for training: PUSH measures bar velocity when benching and squatting, and Free Lap digitally measures athletes max velocity and miles per hour. Twenty-one athletes have tested faster than 20mph. In lieu of traditional chapels, 6th-12th grade students engage in discussions while in a small group setting facilitated by their advisor each week. Our Middle and Upper School pastors create videos and questions for students to discuss as they walk out their faith and apply these important spiritual principles to their lives.





In 2015, Liberty started youth athletics with two sports. Now, Liberty Youth Athletics organizes and manages eight sports with 300 multisport participants from Pre-K to fifth grade.

75 seniors painted personal parking spots this year. Liberty started this tradition with the Senior Class of 2018.





To provide our families a new opportunity for online learning, Liberty Connect was created this past summer with 76 students. Additionally, five families are enrolled in Liberty Connect who are currently not in the state of Texas. Liberty learning can happen anywhere and anytime!

More than 10 percent of our 2020 graduates continued their sport at the collegiate level.





Our Spiritual Life Department partners with K-5 students and parents by offering family discussion guides.





Teacher Sustainability Goal - \$254,000

After generous donations to date, the 20-21 fiscal year goal is \$254,000 to continue moving toward the overall goal of \$1.6 million, leading Liberty into a competitive market that allows our community to keep and hire the best Christian professional educators.
